Uri Geller Freud, commonly called **Uri Geller** (well known for his own fame rather than Sigmund Freud, whom he is related to), is able to bend spoons, make broken clocks and watches tick once more and read minds – all done through the power of his mind. He now prefers to be called a "mystifier" over "psychic".

Geller claimed that he became aware of his unusual powers when he was five. While having lunch one day, the spoon in his hand curled up and broke, even though he didn't apply any pressure to it. Geller's intuitive abilities have also led him to dowsing – and successfully detected oil and precious metals. One example is the huge offshore oil field for Mexico's national oil company PEMEX. His exceptional talent resulted in his getting a Mexican nationality as a token of appreciation and honour by Mexico's President Jose Lopez Portillo. His other works include tracking serial killers, working with the FBI and the CIA, to others which are too confidential and controversial to mention.

Geller believes that the human mind is the most powerful tool in the universe, and for this, he is an inspirational motivational speaker. He has given lectures to large multinational companies such as Henkel, Novartis, Mizuno, Sony, Rolls Royce, Hallmark and even in the sports arena to Formula One, Premier League footballers, boxers and many more.

With his exceptional abilities, Geller has garnered immense wealth. He was also featured in the show *Lifestyles of the Rich and Famous*. He is also noted for donating generously to charity.
